National Child Abuse Prevention Month

Baby steps

- Meet and greet your neighbors
- Go to a parents meeting at your child's school
- Participate in an activity at your local library or community center

Small steps

- Set up a playgroup in your community at homes or local park (consider inviting people who may not have children at home, like local seniors)
 - Organize a community babysitting co-op
 - Volunteer at your child's school through the school's administration or the parent's organization
- Encourage local service providers to produce a directory of available services that are easy to find in the community

Big steps

- Organize a community event (a block party, father/daughter dance, parent support group)
 - Run for an office in the parent organization at your child's school
- Attend local government meetings (city council or school board meetings) and let them know how important resources are in your community. Let them know how parks, strong schools, and accessible services help to strengthen your family and other families.

April is National Child Abuse Prevention Month, a time to recognize that we each can play a part in promoting the social and emotional well-being of children and families in communities.

Interested in helping out Maine's youth in care? Order a "Maine's a Great Place for Kids" license plate today and you'll help support kids in foster care or kinship placements!

\$10 of the annual fee will be transferred to a special fund for Kids in Maine from the original fee and \$5 from the renewal fee will be used for administration and production costs of the plate. Monies will go to the Department of Education to help support after school programming as well as to kids in foster care or kinship placements to support recreational activities as well as summer camps.

Cost to order a plate: \$25, in addition to the regular motor vehicle registration fee. Renewal of the plates will cost \$15 annually to your regular registration fee

Meet the Staff of AFFM!





Awards will range from \$150.00 to \$300.00 and will be sent directly to the camp, once the applicant has been enrolled at the music camp of his or her choice.

Priority will be given to applicants living in kinship homes.

Family issues I address include interpersonal communication, conflict resolution, blended-family struggles, and what I call "compassionate divorce/disengagement." I work best with clients from middle-school age through adulthood, including adolescents, and I can provide referrals for younger children to clinicians who are highly qualified in the above areas.

Philosophy & Values

We all have an inner wisdom that often is overwhelmed by interference or "static" from the world around us. When we learn to be still and really listen, we can hear our own wise heart and follow its direction. I believe that human growth occurs in a relational context, and we all have the ability to envision a better life and create our own solutions. To me, therapy is a collaborative process in which clients join to discover possibilities, set achievable goals, and follow the chosen path. I provide a safe space in which to explore challenges, gain insight into underlying needs and how best to meet them, and acquire tools needed to strengthen important relationships.

What is Multidimensional Treatment (MT)?

- MT provides an opportunity for a youth to live successfully
 with a family while helping to prepare the youth's natural
 family to sustain positive changes that have occurred.
- Placements are short term, typically 6-9 months. Each home has only one MT placement at a time.
- MT is community-based treatment in a home setting for youths 12-17 with emotional and behavioral challenges.

What Type of Support Will My Family Receive?

- You will receive a high level of support from MT staff. The program supervisor is on-call 24 hours a day for any assistance.
- · You receive daily phone contact and attend weekly support meetings.
- You are provided with extensive and ongoing training to ensure you use specific behavior management skills to help these teens.
- · You receive financial compensation of \$525.00 per week, which is tax-free.

Tamarack Vacation

The Wilhelm Reich Museum is owned and operated by The Wilhelm Reich Infant Trust. This Trust was established by world renowned scientist, Wilhelm Reich, in his Last Will and Testament. The Trust maintains the property at Orgonon under the name and style of the Wilhelm Reich Museum. On this land is his cabin, Tamarack. Mr. Reich's Will also stated that Tamarack be used as a "summer home for children." The Trust has chosen a way to fulfill this final wish by making Tamarack available for adoptive, foster, and kinship families for five weeks in the summer! This opportunity is available to those that might not have another means of this type of vacation. Mary Higgins, trustee, works with AFFM on this opportunity annually.

The cabin is located on the grounds of Orgonon, formerly the home, laboratory, and research center of Wilhelm Reich. Orgonon is located just off of the Dodge Pond Road in Rangeley. Tamarack is about 75 yards away from Dodge Pond.

Because the pond is a natural nesting place for loons, power boats, jet skis, and recreational vehicles (i.e. four wheelers) are all strictly prohibited. Rowboats and canoes are permitted. At the foot of the path leading to the pond is a floating platform, a great spot for shore fishing, sunbathing, and jumping in the water. The water is deep and the area is quite rocky. Children will require careful supervision and non-swimmers will require life jackets.

Tamarack is a large, charming, 3 bedroom, 1 bath cabin with a comfortable interior. Tamarack has a complete kitchen with a full size refrigerator and gas stove, and a beautiful living room with a stone fireplace. The camp does not have a phone or television.

Families need to provide their own food and bedding. The Tamarack vacation opportunity is designed for the families who otherwise might not be able to afford a vacation, so there are certain eligibility requirements that apply.

To be eligible, you must not own or have access to a summer camp, time-share, or RV. Also, if you have been a Tamarack winner in 2011 and 2012, we ask that you not apply. The drawing will be held April 7th and winners will be notified by phone or email by April 21st.





Many families dearly want to utilize Tamarack. It is necessary that any winners who cannot attend please notify AFFM at least one week in advance. It is important to have time to find an alternate family and give them time to prepare for their vacation, so this beautiful cabin can be enjoyed throughout the heart of the summer.
