Are you aware that AFFM has a lending library? AFFM has Books and DVD's on a variety of topics relevant to the care you are providing. The lending library can help you gain knowledge on topics such as; ADHD, ADD, RAD, Adoption, special needs, fostering, FASD, DAB, aging out and much more. Once you've made a selection simply call the AFFM office and our staff will be happy to take your requests. For families local to or in the area of Orono please feel free to stop into the office to make your selections.

Have you adopted a child in the past year? If so, please let us help you celebrate by inviting you to one or more adoption month activities. If appropriate we'd also love to share your exciting news in the Family Ties Newsletter.

AFFM staff has recently expanded. We hope this helps to serve you in a more expeditious and respectful manner. We understand that in matters of family, it is difficult to have to wait to get answers to serious concerns. Our staff has someone available 24/7 for emergencies and from 8-4:30 Monday through Friday for routine issues.

AFFM staff are also available to attend Family Team meetings with you if you are feeling the need for some support.

Have you received a letter from DHHS indicating an allegation or licensing violation has been made towards you or a member of your household? Our Allegation Team will assist you in understanding the process and the time frames associated with an allegation.

Do you need someone to help you understand an issue regarding kinship care, foster care or adoption? Our staff is well trained to respond to your questions and concerns. When a question is posed that we are unsure of it will be researched and we will get back to you as soon as possible.

AFFM has disposable diapers. Donations are requested of \$2.00 per dozen.

Has your daughter (sizes 4-6-8) had a Mary Lake dress? They are perfect for back to school! Mary plans to make more for the holidays as well.


