Adoptive and Foster Families of Maine, Inc. (AFFM) provides support services for adoptive, foster parents and kinship providers. The services are for all adoptive and foster families who are licensed by the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) or have DHHS approval to adopt. AFFM also provides services to kinship families not in the formal system.

Child welfare is dependent upon a myriad of state and federal laws, rules and regulations. Decisions concerning families and innocent children are rarely easy, and are usually fraught with highly emotional issues. AFFM is dedicated to assisting families to help children find the security they deserve. Every situation in fostering, adoption and kinship is unique. AFFM helps prepare families for the challenges they will face, and is a resource that is easily accessible. AFFM is available 24/7.

AFFM believes that Maine's children have the right to be a permanent member of a stable, healthy family. For adoptive, foster and kinship caregivers to provide the best parenting and in a quality home environment, they need to add to their own strengths through training and the unconditional support of AFFM. AFFM believes that when decisions are made that affect the rest of a child's life, there is no room for politics or personalities. AFFM believes that families who are willing to open their hearts and homes to provide for Maine's children, must have total support. Have You Heard About AFFM's Mentor Service?

The Resource Family Mentor Service provides newly licensed resource families with encouragement, and guidance through a 1 on 1 relationship with an experienced peer. The Resource Parent Mentor is available to support, encourage, and inform new resource families to effectively partner with DHHS. The mentor will inform the family of resources and community linkages intended to strengthen and preserve the family. Mentors will also encourage recruits to take part in continuing education.

AFFM is extremely thankful to current mentors for the important role they play in supporting newer families. Mentors take time from their own families and activities to insure caregivers have an increased understanding of DHHS policy & practices, utilizing non-judgmental listening support. They also serve as a link between DHHS and AFFM.

New caregivers say they appreciate the enriched feedback they receive from people who provide the insider feedback and get them in touch with others who can help. Mentors tell us, they feel valued and take pride in helping a new family learn from their experiences. Mentors say, "I wish I had a mentor when I was first starting out. I felt in the dark. I didn't know who I could go to for quick help or to just to vent my frustrations with without feeling like I was being judged."

Passes and Discounts!

The Resource Parent Care Team is excited to announce that we are now completing assessments with resource parents for in home services. This service is provided by a clinician or bachelor level specialist to mitigate stressors in your home. The in home component of this program allows staff to work with you, as parents, to educate, inform, and support through the challenges and success' of this ever-evolving role. This team can work on providing attachment and trauma education, increasing family engagement and communication, supporting through transitions of children, and addressing behavioral concerns and needs. This service comes free to all resource homes regardless of licensure status. This services continues to be a collaboration between the Department of Health and Human Services, Spurwink and Community Health and Counseling Services. The systems you may encounter might include: child protection, education, special education, corrections and the court system. Sheila and Carey can often help with making referrals and obtaining materials goods that your family may be in need of.
