Updates on Passes

AFFM is excited to announce families are now able to use the discount card as admissions into the children's museums and now the Maine Wildlife Park!

It is important that you call AFFM at 827-2331 with the date you wish to visit a museum or the wildlife park as it's still required only one resource family attends per day. Your AFFM Discount Card can be used as your pass for up to 6 people for a day's visit to the children's museums.

*Note, the Children's Discovery Museum in Augusta is closed and plans to reopen in Waterville. Please visit http://www.childrensdiscoverymuseum.org/ for more information.

State park passes are still available to <u>licensed foster homes</u>. If you are interested in receiving a state park pass please contact AFFM. We ask that you have your foster care Id number (found on your license), readily available.

AFFM will **not** have discounted passes to York's Wild Kingdom this year. As businesses are attempting to adjust to a new norm, York's Wild Kingdom will only be opening the zoo at a discounted price. As they approach what would be their busiest time of the year, this closure will have a significant financial impact on York's Wild Kingdom and they are unable to provide a donation.

Please note, due to Covid-19, the museums, York's Wild Kingdom, and the Maine Wildlife Park will have new protocols in place for your safety. Please visit their websites for further information.

Grandparents and other kinship caregivers, are you aware that decisions are being made right now regarding how the next round of funds pertaining to COVID 19 are being considered?

Are you concerned that you as a kinship grandfamily, you may be left out of the equation?

If so now is the time to speak up. Call your Senators and Congressmen. Tell them your special story. Let them know how the pandemic has affected you, the children in your care and their parents.

Have visits been difficult and/or curtailed? How does this affect the children, your schedule and the parents efforts? Are you a senior citizen caring for a grandchild or another relative's child and additionally caring for an aging parent? Do you have difficulty accessing food for you and your family? Have you suffered the loss of a job and income? Are you struggling to help the kids keep up with such work as we shelter in place?

All these questions and more concern kinship families. This is a time when many issues are on the table. If you believe kinship caregivers should be compensated in some way during this unique and challenging time let your concerns be heard.
