My teen in care started a job at McDonalds over the winter. It turned out the judge on her case worked at the same McDonalds location when he was a teenager, though he was paid significantly less! Then this spring, she was playing tennis at school, and the same judge told us how his mother remembers losing to my daughter's tennis team 82 years ago! It was so nice that the judge was willing to share those stories and make a connection with my daughter.

I would like to submit a pretty funny story that literally just made everyone in my house bust out laughing so hard! This past Friday all the kids and myself were just chilling out at home, Kaliina came into my room where I was watching a movie and she wants to play, so she gets up on my bed and starts jumping on my stomach (playfully that is) and I look at her and say "Kaliina you are so lucky Mumma does not have to fart or puke right now with all that jumping on my stomach". She instantly stands up (on the bed next to me) and as she is slowly rolling her eyes in the back of her head and falls backwards onto a pillow and pretends to pass out. I say "Kaliina what on earth was that?" She stands up and without missing a beat looks me straight in the eyes as she is slowly waving her hand back and forth in front of her nose and says "Mumma stinky farted" We all instantly started laughing so hard and I say to her "Mumma is not stinky" and as she is sliding off the bed laughing from the bottom of her belly starting to run out of the room she screams "Mumma is stinky and Kaliina funny" and she ran out straight into the next room laughing so hard. Kaliina has been fully adopted since August of 2022, and this little spit ball of fire has brought so much life into our home. She is funny, sweet and sassy (our little sour patch kid, sometimes sweet and sometimes super sour lol) and just so much fun to be around. NEVER a dull moment. She has thrived beyond what I could have ever imagined in such a short time.

JOIN US FOR HAMPDEN CHILDREN'S DAY AUGUST 12TH @9AM


Come decorate bikes and ride/walk in the parade!

BACK TO SCHOOL PROGRAM



AFFM's Back to School Program provides a new backpack, grade appropriate school supplies, personal care items and when available, a new outfit. The program serves children in grades kindergarten (age 5) to senior year of high school.

Please note, AFFM's Back to School Program relies heavily on donations to fill the backpacks. You may not receive all the items requested. Please have your request in no later than Friday, August 4th.

*If your child is entering 7th grade up to high school, AFFM may be able to provide a \$25 gift card. As teens tend to have their own style of clothing, AFFM hopes to provide kids going into middle school and high school with gift cards to purchase their own outfits. The Back-to-School Program was designed to bring a sense of normalcy to kids in care, especially at the beginning of a school year. AFFM is aware providing teens the opportunity to pick their own clothing may help ease some anxiety as they transition into a new school.

A Message from OCFS Medical Director

In case you have not heard, OCFS has launched two exciting new programs for young children and families. Help Me Grow (HMG) and the Early Childhood Consultation Program (ECCP) are available throughout Maine.

Help Me Grow (HMG) connects families of young children (pregnancy through age 8) to information and services. Caregivers and providers can contact HMG for support and receive short-term care coordination for up to 60 days for a variety of needs. HMG Resource Specialists will listen, share developmental information and community resources, and provide follow-up to caregivers and referral sources. To learn more go to: Help Me Grow Maine ECCP® is a prevention service that partners a mental health consultant with adults who work with infants and young children ages 0-8 where they learn and grow, such as child care, preschool, pre-K, and public school. ECCP® provides short-term consultation to child care providers, teachers, and families to help understand children's needs, address challenging behavior, and support healthy social and emotional development before mental health or early intervention treatment is needed. Consultation is no-cost and confidential. OCFS is now expanding ECCP® statewide after a successful pilot of the program. To learn more go to: Early Childhood Consultation Program
