RESOURCE PARENT CARE TEAM(RPCT)

RPCT is a voluntary program. You determine what your family needs to be successful. We encourage the use of our Liaison services to talk about day-to-day concerns and ask questions as this can help families feel more supported and confident in caring for children.

Liaison Support: The Liaisons are located in local DHHS offices and are available by phone and email. Liaisons help enhance communication amongst resource families, OCFS staff, and community-based providers. They provide information about community resources, general support, and problem-solving assistance. All resource families are eligible for the service provided by the Liaison assigned to your area.

Clinical In-home Services: Clinical support is provided by a licensed mental health clinician and offered at no cost. Clinical services provide education and support related to the complex experiences of resource families including managing difficult behavior, grief and loss, trauma, attachment, community resources, and many more. The RPCT is fully staffed and each district has their own individual clinician they have access to.

BE THERE FOR ME

The Maine Child Welfare Action Network (MCWAN) and the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) announced July 30th the launch of Be There for ME, a new campaign for parents and caregivers in Maine and the people who support them. The campaign aims to reduce the stigma of asking for help and provides a judgement-free place for parents and caregivers to start to find support.

MCWAN and DHHS developed Be There for ME over the past year in partnership with a diverse group of parents and caregivers, as well as many community organizations. The campaign reflects the types of support parents and caregivers of children of all ages said they need and how they spoke about their experiences. The website connects parents and caregivers to resources to start to find support for family needs—including housing, getting everyday items, child care, and dealing with stress. Available in 12 languages, the website is

designed to welcome parents, caregivers, and all those who are there for them by encouraging them to take the first step toward support even if they're not sure where to go.

KINSHIP CORNER



On July 30th, the White House hosted a convening on transforming child welfare to announce new policies that focus on preventing family separation and supporting and creating opportunities for families and youth. The convening brought together policymakers across federal, state, local, and tribal governments, philanthropy, child welfare and family support organizations, and young people and families who have personal experiences, to encourage further innovation, build new partnerships, and exchange best practices. The new announcements focus on four key areas:

- Separating Poverty and Neglect
- Prevention Services

The new policies can be read in full here.

• Prioritizing Kin and Youth Needs

- Allowing child welfare agencies to draw on federal funds to finance background check operations to facilitate quicker licensing for kin and others who provide foster care.
- Rolling out a new website spotlights states and Tribes that have adopted new kinship licensing rules, as well as data on their kinship placement rates.
- Publishing a resource guide on federal programs that provide supports to grandparents and kin in their caregiving roles.
- Conducting a series of listening sessions to identify federal flexibilities needed for states and Tribes to adopt kinship licensing rules and kinship first approaches.
- Innovations and Research
