A MESSAGE FROM OCFS MEDICAL DIRECTOR

Healthy habits can help children succeed in school. With all the excitement and emotions of the upcoming holidays, you can help children grow and thrive, at school and at home, by focusing on healthy habits. More information on health and safety is available on HealthyChildren.org

Focus on sleep, exercise and nutrition- make sure children have a good healthy breakfast before they head to school. Encourage children and youth to drink water through the day, get daily exercise, and maintain a healthy sleep schedule.

Tune into your child's mental health- look for changes in behavior, ask how they are feeling. Build in self-care and outside activities. If your child needs mental health support, there are resources available through schools, and in the community. Let your child know it is okay to talk about their feelings.

Plan for mindful media use in your home and through out the day- help children choose high- quality, age appropriate games and programs, and balance screen time with sleep, exercise and other healthy activities.

Stay up to date on check ups and immunizations. Check with your child's physician if they are due for a check up, or for any immunizations, including the flu vaccine.

Mandated Reporter Training 12/4/24 Time: 6PM-8PM

All resource families are required to take the mandated reporter training when becoming licensed. They also need to renew this training every 4 years! Join us here for mandated reporter training and receive 2 training hours towards recertification! Mandated Reporters are a critical part of Maine's Child protection system and act as an early warning network to identify suspected child abuse and neglect; promptly enough to avoid serious and long term damage to a child.

In this training, you will understand setting boundaries for healthy relationships. This training will answer some of the common issues and concerns when setting boundaries.

Food for Thought and a Plea for Creative Ideas

Housing shortages in Maine are at an all time high! Children entering kinship care both through Child Protective Services and private placements or through the Probate Court is also at an all time high!

Here is the dilemma: Grandparents, other relatives and fictive kin generally have children join into their households without any prior notice. They may live in senior housing where children are not permitted, they may live in their own homes but have limited bedroom /sleeping space. They may have a bedroom but not enough beds. They may or may not have a vehicle. If they do have a car it may not accommodate infant and toddler car seats or be large enough to cover the number that they need to transport. The issues go on!!!

The kinship navigators have been working with a number of other agencies in an attempt to find adequate housing etc. for several Maine kin families. AFFM has limited funds to support kin caregivers and the families are so appreciative of all that they receive. However, it does not go far and staff are struggling to increase their own awareness of housing possibilities. Feel free to share any ideas you may have with Bette Hoxie and the Kinship Navigators across the state.

An example of one family has this scenario: A single grandmother is caring for 2 minor grandchildren, an 18 year old grandson who is a senior in high school and she is the full time caregiver to an adult disabled son. She was evicted over a year ago and has been moving from one motel to another. She qualifies for a housing voucher but thus far nothing that will meet the need she has to fit the 5 of them has become available. She does not own a vehicle so each time she has to move from a hotel to another she has to take from her limited social security benefits to rent a uhaul. She has to throw food and sometimes acquired items away to be sure all will fit in the u haul. There has to be a better way!

This is meant to be informative as well as a bid for creative housing ideas. AFFM and the Kinship Program welcome your suggestions!
