## How The Kinship Program Can Help



Kinship care refers to the care of children by relatives or close family friends (often referred to as fictive kin). A kinship home is the preferred placement for children who cannot safely be cared for by their parents.

Kinship care helps to maintain the child's connection to their family and increases the chance for positive outcomes.

For children entering state custody, Maine DHHS requires that the family be licensed as a foster home.

Children may also be cared for by a relative without DHHS taking custody of the child, this is referred to as informal kinship care.



AFFM brings awareness to the general public, policymakers, and potential kinship caregivers of the needs, challenges, benefits, and joys of kinship care.

The kinship program provides non-judgmental, empathetic, and knowledgeable peer support staff to assist families as they navigate an array of supportive systems.
